Introduction

This policy statement sets out the Academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the Academy, for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the Academy's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997, the Skills and Post-16 Education Act 2022 and page 43 of guidance from the Department for Education (DfE) on careers guidance and access for education and training providers.

Pupil entitlement

All pupils in years 8-11 are entitled:

- to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
